

## Fact Sheet 1: Ideas for Organizing

## **In Your Union**

★ Pass a resolution endorsing the Just Health Care campaign in your local union.

★ Set up a local union Just Health Care committee and develop an overall education and mobilization strategy for the local.

★ Plan a series of educational and training events for stewards meetings or other forums that bring union activists together.

★ Sign up local union members to the Committee of a Million. Set goals and compete with other union locals.

★ Use the Just Health Care questionnaire to find out what your members think. Publicize the results.

★ Integrate the fight for Just Health Care into the union's contract campaigns or other mobilizations.

 $\star$  Attend corporate stockholders meetings and speak out on the issue.

 $\bigstar$  Host a meeting of other unions to expand the campaign.

 $\bigstar$  Set up literature tables and/or offer to speak on the issue at labor events.

★ Ask to speak to the Central Labor Council and organize member locals to win endorsement of the campaign.

★ Write letters to political candidates to ask to meet with them and ask for their endorsement.

★ Use the local press and the labor press to publicize your activities.

## **In Your Community**

★ Hold a house party of interested neighbors to discuss Just Health Care.

 $\star$  Use the Committee of a Million sheets to canvass a neighborhood.

 $\bigstar$  Identify potential allies in the community, meet with key leaders, and offer to speak at their meetings.

 $\star$  Use community events, festivals and parades to promote the campaign.

★ Write letters to the editor of your local newspaper (don't forget the small "shoppers news" papers published in most communities)

★ Call in on radio talk shows about the issue.

 $\bigstar$  Attend candidates' forums and ask questions.

 $\star$  Organize your own town hall meeting or candidates forum that is co-sponsored by other groups in the community.

★ Organize a rally, picket line or demonstration to call attention to community health care issues such as a hospital closing, nursing shortage, etc.

 $\star$  Ask the mayor or city council to issue a proclamation endorsing Just Health Care.

 $\star$  Organize a non-binding referendum campaign.

★ Use the local press to publicize your activities.
